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INTRODUCTION

This brief presents an analysis of central government expenditure from January to end April 2020. It aims to inform Senior Management on the composition of total expenditure by different classification, highlight the absorption capacity of different budget entities (BEs), and give an indication of expenditure trends compared to the same period a year earlier. It should be noted that all expenditure referred to in this brief is solely Government Local Fund (GLF), and the report does not factor any donor funds (loans and grants), including those earmarked for development projects across the country.

TOTAL GOVERNMENT EXPENDITURE

Government's total expenditure as of end April 2020 amounted to **D5.08 Billion**, which represents an increase of 29% compared to the same period last year.

Personnel Emolument (PE) and Other Recurrent (OC) collectively consumed 50 percent of total expenditure. Meanwhile, PE has increased from D1.0 billion in April 2019 to D1.3 billion in April 2020, representing a yearly growth of 31 percent. The increase is partially attributed to additional teachers recruited under the Education sector.

In comparison to last year, Debt Service decreased by 51 percent from D1.2 billion to D607 million which is as a result of debt deferral from our creditiors. Meanwhile, expenditure on Capital Development has increased by 348 percent relative to last year, due to the first installment paid for the Banjul Rehabilitation Project. Overall, Capital Development consumed about 14 percent of the total GLF expenditure.

Table 2 above compares the different budget classes against the 2020 approved budget, highlighting their absorption capacities. Subvention to Public Corporations is the highest absorbing budget class with 39 percent of its budget consumed to date, whilst Debt Service remains the lowest with 8 percent of its' approved budget spent as of end April 2020. The different budget classes have collectively consumed 24 percent of the approved budget.

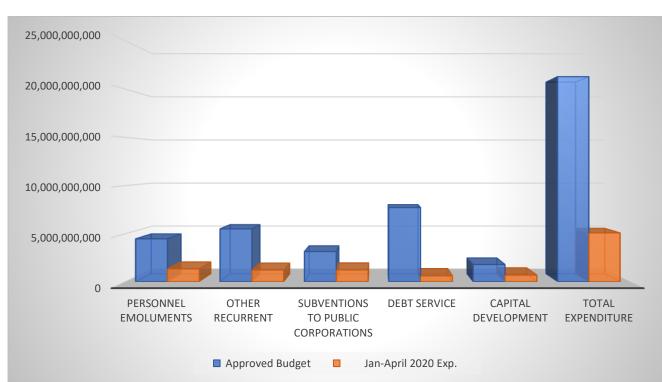


Chart 1: Central Government Expenditure for End April 2020 compared to Approved budget, Source: IFMIS

Personnel Emolument increased from D1.0 billion in April 2019 to D1.3 billion in April 2020, recording a year-to-year growth of 31 percent. Basic Salary constitutes 49 percent of total PE, which registered a growth of 35 percent, increasing from D492 Million in 2019 to D664 Million in 2020. Allowance has also increased by 27 percent as compared to the same period last year, from D450 million to D571 million.

The table above shows the approved budget for PE as compared to April 2020 expenditure. Basic Salary and Allowances both consumed 30 percent of their approved budgets as of end April 2020. Meanwhile, expenditure on the ECA did reach 37% of its annual budget.

I. TOP TEN SPENDING BUDGET ENTITIES (BEs)

The top ten highest spending Budget Entities collectively consumed 91 percent of total expenditure. MoBSE and Centralised Services topped the list, consuming 18% and 15% respectively.

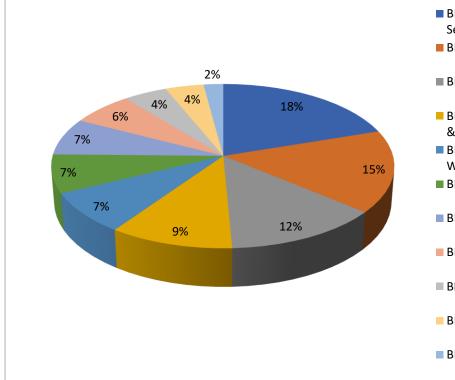


Chart 2: Top Spending Budget Entities as at End April 2020 as a percentage

II. TOP TEN SPENDING BUDGET LINES

Contribution to International organizations registered the highest absorption rate among the top spending line items, with 135 percent of its budget spent as of end April 2020. The bulk of the payment was towards settling arrears owed to the West Africa Examination Council (WAEC). Roads and Bridges budget line has absorbed 98 percent of its budget for the year, followed by Rents and Rates, where 48 percent of the budget has been spent to date.
